Add the 2AW.07 regarding State Welcome Signs with the revised Standard and Option and deletion of the Guidance.

Note: FHWA proposed changes to the MUTCD are shown with text additions in 39 underline blue. Proposed changes to FHWA Concept are shown with text deletions in 40 strikeout red and additions in underline green. 41 42 Section 2AW.07 State Welcome Signs 43 44 Support: The design, placement, and function of State Welcome signs differ from Jurisdictional 45 Boundary (I2-1)signs (see Section 2HAW.05) located at State lines. Because of these 46 differences, it is necessary to distinguish State Welcome signs from Jurisdictional Boundary 47 48 signs. Option: 49 50 A State Welcome sign may be placed located at or in the general vicinity of the State boundary except as prohibited in Paragraph 4 of this Section. 51 State Welcome signs may display the State seal, the officially adopted State motto or slogan, 52 53 and the name of the Governor, in addition to the State name. State Welcome signs may use legend and background colorsthat provide adequate visual contrast other than the standard sign 54 colors. 55 **Standard:** 56 State Welcome signs shall not be located where they could interfere with or detract 57 from othertraffic control devices. If used, State Welcome signs shall be installed as 58 independent, post-mounted sign assemblies. 59 60 Guidance: 61 62 State Welcome signs should display the name of the state being entered and be clearly legible 63 by drivers in relation to the background of the sign. These signs should not include forms of 64 advertising, accomplishments or references toweb-sites. 65 66 State Welcome signs shall not display changeable or other electronic-display messages 67 (see Chapter2L). State Welcome signs shall not display messages that emulate promotional 68 advertising of any type. State Welcome signs shall not incorporate Acknowledgment signs 69 or messages (see Section 2H.08), orlogo sign panels (see Section 2J.03) into their legends or 70 assemblies. Telephone numbers, Internet addresses and e-mail addresses, including domain 71 names and uniform resource locators (URL), and quick-response (QR) codes, bar codes, or 72 other graphics intended for optical scanning for the purpose of obtaining information shall 73 74 not be displayed in the legends of State Welcome signs or on their supports. 75 Guidance: 76 77 State Welcome signs should be located farther from the edge of the roadway than other traffic controldevices. State Welcome signs should not be installed on limited access or other 78 facilities where stopping at the roadside is restricted to emergency purposes. 79 The size of a State Welcome sign should be consistent with and not exceed the prevailing size 80 of other guide signs based on the roadway type. 81 82 83 **TECHNICAL COMMITTEE VOTE:** 84 For: 20
